“Light Is Hope”

According to the Club's President, **Tracy Rice**, “We felt that after the long pandemic and all the strife in the world today we could use the power of photography to shine a light on images that convey a sense of hope and optimism. The images in the exhibition are unique works of art created by 30 local artists, taken close to home and far away, of widely varying subject matter in distinctly different styles.”

When asked about the decision to host the exhibition at the Peachtree Corners Library Tracy said, “We knew we wanted to exhibit the work in a public space within Peachtree Corners. The library is large, centrally located, is open to the public every day of the week and has lots of empty wall space. The librarians are very excited to have 100 large prints of art filling their walls, especially ones of such high quality from local artists.”

“It gives people yet another reason to visit the library,” she continued. “We also love it because there are still a lot of people who don't know about our club, and the exhibition will introduce us to more people who may have a passion for photography.”

The library is set to host the “Light Is Hope” Grand Opening and Juror's Talk on Saturday, February 25. Visitors will hear the juror talk about her process of selecting the photos from those submitted. Amanda will also lead a walk through the Exhibition and discuss many of the photos on display.

Exhibition Artists' Talk set for February 25

On Saturday, February 25, there will be an Artists' Talk at the library, from 10:30 a.m. to 12 p.m. Visitors will be able to roam through the exhibition and talk with the artists whose work is displayed. They'll learn the backstories of the photographs — where the photos were taken, what attracted the photographers' eyes to take the photos, how they took them and how they edited them to make original pieces of art.



As photography clubs go, the Peachtree Corners Photography Club is relatively young, having been founded in 2017. The group's purpose is to educate, encourage and expand the photographic knowledge and capabilities of its members.

Club meetings and other events

The photography club hosts a monthly meeting at Atlanta Tech Park on the second Thursday of every month. Meetings are free and open to the public. The club also holds a virtual technical webinar on the fourth Tuesday of every month for paid members, and it hosts guided field trips, meetups and workshops throughout the year.

The Peachtree Corners Photography Club has grown substantially in the last three years, and it became a recognized 501(c)(3)

non-profit organization last year. Tracy said, “I am always amazed at the large number of very skilled photographers we have in and around Peachtree Corners, and the number seems to be growing exponentially every day! Our club is a wonderful resource for photographers of all skill levels, from beginners to pros, to continually grow their skills and share their love of photography with other like-minded people.”

few in their 90s. In addition, plans are in the works to offer membership scholarships to high school students with an interest in the medium.

The club's mission is to educate, and monthly meetings and webinars, along with occasional workshops and field trips, benefit all levels of expertise, from beginners to seasoned professionals.

"We try to bring our skills together and help everyone improve," said board member Brian Walton.

Most participants are serious hobbyists eager to learn, but even those whose only camera is a cellphone are welcome. The exhibit includes some cellphone shots.

"I tell people, don't be ashamed of it; they take fantastic photos," said Rice. "If you can understand composition and lighting, you can take some good photos. The camera is just a tool."

AMC rolls out new pricing program

Better seats at movie theater cost in U.S. to cost more

AMC has begun chipping for better seats in its theaters in a few cities as it rolls out the policy out by the end of the year.

The program, due to roll out in late February, will give a discount to patrons willing to crane the neck for the front row, while "preferred" sections will cost \$1 or \$2 more.

This policy will affect showings after 4 p.m. who sign up for AMC subscription program to pay the extra charge for the nation's largest theater chain headquartered in Las Vegas City, Missouri.
